Mayor John Nations

John Nations was elected Chesterfield's fifth mayor in April 2001 on a progressive platform of improving City services, expanding the City's business base, increasing parks and recreation opportunities, and constructing partnerships with residents, businesses, neighboring communities and other levels of government to enhance the quality of life both within the City of Chesterfield and throughout the St. Louis region. The City of Chesterfield is now widely regarded as one of the premier communities in the United States. He was re-elected in 2005 and 2009.

Mayor Nations is a life-long resident of St. Louis County. He received his Bachelors Degree in Public Administration from the University of Missouri - St. Louis, and received his Law Degree from Saint Louis University. He is a partner in the law firm of Armstrong - Teasdale, LLP.

Citizens Committee for the Environment

The [Citizens Committee for the Environment](#) (CCE) actively participates in City and regional events to promote resource conservation and environmental awareness. The CCE also develops and disseminates educational materials on topics such as recycling, composting and proper disposal of household hazardous waste. The CCE hosts the Annual Earth, Tree, & Arbor Day celebration, community recycle drives, and other fun environmental education events.

Bikeable Walkable Community Plan



In April of 2009, the City of Chesterfield partnered with Trailnet, a regional leader in creating healthy and active communities, to develop a bicycle and pedestrian master plan for the City of Chesterfield.

The planning phase consisted of multiple public forums that allowed residents to become involved in the planning process. City staff worked directly with Trailnet to categorize and evaluate ways to expand and advance transportation for bicycle and pedestrian commuters while reducing demand for vehicular travel.

The plan focuses on safety and connectivity, linking residents to parks, schools, local shops and businesses and other destinations through an interconnected network of trails, on-street bike facilities and pedestrian amenities. The plan is a tool for City staff and elected officials to reference the needs and goals of the community to improve bicycle and pedestrian commuting and help to implement future infrastructure improvements in the City as resources and local support become available.

The Chesterfield [Bikeable Walkable Community Plan](#) was officially adopted on March 15, 2010 by City Council Resolution 302.
